

BPQG 2024 Annual Business Meeting Minutes



The annual meeting was called to order at 6:32 pm by President Genia Smith.

The nominating committee slate of 2026 officers was presented: president Kim Kidder, Co-Vice Presidents Mary Butler and Genia Smith, Secretary Jennifer Cook, Treasurer Freddia Sullivent. The members were asked to make a motion to accept the slate as presented. Ann McEvoy made the first motion and Cindy Dorzab seconded the nomination. The motion passed all in favor.

Genia explained she was going to go to new business next- the charitable donation. Our guild members presented options for the \$300 donation. Discussion from the membership regarding splitting the amount and the charitable options. It was determined more can be done by not splitting it. There were three options voted on: the Farmers Food Pantry, Manes and Miracles, and the Good Samaritan Clinic. Nomination was made by Joanie Coffman to cease nominations and Seconded by Beth Corley. Votes were counted and the donation will go to the Good Samaritan Clinic.

President Genia Smith reminded the membership what the board recommended for increasing the dues for 2025. To add the required \$20 and increase to \$55 for a total of \$75, paid in 3 months if needed. Discussion began with the question posed by Cindy Dorzab to explain the expenditures in 2024- all bills are in except classes and figure out how much is spent at camp and how much are people donating. Genia explained the guild lost money on the quilt show and finding a venue for the 2026 quilt show was going to be even more expensive. The cost of quilt camp was brought up by Sandy Birch and Genia informed her and all members none of camp was paid for by the guild, so that money was not included in the budget except for as a line item. Kathy Hart and Joanie Coffman both encouraged the combining of the required donation with the dues for many reasons but mainly because there are too many people who are not paying their portion and it is increasingly difficult for members to remember if they paid the dues. Ann McEvoy suggested not raising it to \$55 but add the donation fee. Genia said we needed to vote on the recommendation at hand first. Genia asked if there was anymore discussion and Vi Brown said many members said they would not join with dues that high. Sarah Monk also stated surrounding guilds were not as high. Genia informed the membership we bring in speakers and it is getting increasingly expensive to bring them in and pay all their fees. The guild covers the fee when classes do not fill up as part of the contract each speaker requires the guild to complete. Lynn Meeks questioned how we lost money on the quilt show. Genia explained to her attendance was down by 200 from last year. Vi Brown asked if we ever considered getting a sponsor. Genia informed the guild we have looked into it. For 2026, the quilt show committee is working on ideas to have the Cherokee and Choctaw tribes help underwrite the show. The thought is to have the quilt show be called Quilts of our Heritage and have a special exhibit where they provide quilts, blankets and other crafts. They are also considering doing a 4x6 card with a QR code with a pattern attached. One of the visitors suggested having college students do the cards to save money.

A motion was made by Joanie Coffman to stop discussion and vote; 2nd was Cindy Dorzab. The motion did not pass. A new motion was made by Joanie Coffman to increase the dues to \$35 and add the \$20 donation fee for a \$55 total. Patty Dikeman seconded. Discussion was again started and Lynn Meeks mentioned there were some that considered the donation gambling. Beth Corley stated the by-laws were clear all members were required to purchase or sell \$20. Genia also informed the membership the people who considered it gambling have usually given the \$20 and not taken the tickets. Genia called for a vote. 32 for and 45 no; the motion did not pass.

Gaylon Scharbor suggested keeping the dues at the current rate but adding the \$20 required fee; due in the January meeting and updating the by-laws. Genia made the membership aware if passed, the bylaws would be re-written. One member asked if they could still have three months to pay the dues. Genia asked Gaylon if she wanted to amend her motion to allow a payment option for the \$50 combination; Gaylon did not want to amend her motion to allow payment options since we have the ability to pay by card. Motion was made to vote by Beth Corley and seconded by Cindy Dorzab. Motion carried and the annual meeting was adjourned at 7:15pm.

It was brought to our attention that Quilt Congress is still on our website and needs to be removed.

Door Prizes: winners were Beth Corley, Sandra Cochran, Lula Hansen, Tammy Chavez, Judy Garrett, and Gaylon Scharbor. 50/50 in the amount of \$34.50 was won by Debbie Christie.

We had four guests: Jennifer Mills, Amy and Will Sanford and Bonnie Stacey.

Beth let everyone know Kristie Coburn is having a stocking class. The cost is \$35 which includes your lunch and kit. Sign up with Beth if you want to go. We had show and tell with many people showing their latest quilts. So much talent in our guild.

After a short break, our speaker Linda DeGray gave us a wonderful show and was also a vendor for the guild. Linda showed so many variations of quilts and classes she had at her shop. She also showed us things she wished she did a little differently.

Your dollar (or dollars) combined with every other 50/50 player, supports our guild. And as the name says, each dollar you contribute increases your chance to win 50% of the kitty.




